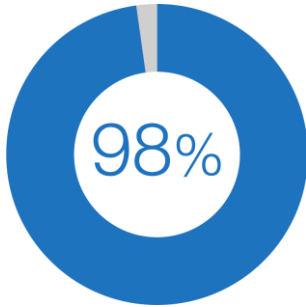


Welcome

Attendance

We are aiming for our school to achieve 98% attendance this year. We are working hard to maximize the learning time children have in school, through our Settling In Time where children can respond to feedback from their teachers, learn spellings, practice handwriting or solve problems and through our children being back in class promptly after each break time to make sure lessons begin on time, Ultimately if children do not attend they will fall behind their peers with each day absent leaving gaps in learning that are difficult to fill as we progress through the curriculum.
