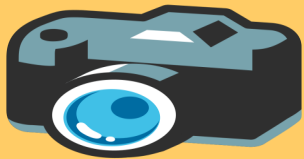

They will be working with new staff and our EYFS children.

Dear Parent/Carer,

I am writing to you with regards to the ICE CATS Program.

Your school has decided to use the program to help support staff and children in school to learn how to respond to evacuation and lockdown procedures. These are things that new legislation requires schools should be planning for and implementing...

I am a Liverpool resident with children of my own, my youngest being of reception age. I have been in school governance for fifteen years and I am fortunate to have a background in security and education. I have use my experience to create a simple 30minute lesson that is a fun and active P.E. lesson, it works with curriculum and teaches children to respond to guidance in a worst case scenario situation.

Whilst as a parent myself, I understand the dangers we face in modern society and the very real threat we are under. I acknowledge the chance of this happening here in school is very slim, but ... What If....!!!

By teaching young children and adults to respond, with simple commands and signals they will become second nature and may very well save lives. They are a life skill that can be used in any environment outside school, but also in any country you may visit.

I would like to stress that at no point are guns, knives, bombs or terrorism mentioned in the training with children unless it is age appropriate. But should children have questions about their safety they will be answered appropriately or privately with teachers and parents.

As a parent I entrust the safety of my children to the school they are assigned and believe that school is an extension of my family that they will care for my children with their safety and care being the utmost priority alongside education.

I understand parents and carers feel unsure of this situation and guidelines currently available and I believe that transparency of the program is of the utmost importance, I will be available at school on Friday 2 November at 9.15am to 9.45am and 3pm – 3.30pm to deliver information regarding this program.
